Referencing and plagiarism

In essays or research projects, you are expected to use information from various trusted sources as well as your own ideas. You must always cite others work that you use. This is called referencing. Proper referencing demonstrates that you have used reliable, credible sources. Using someone else's work or ideas without giving credit is called plagiarism, which may lead to failure of an assessment. 


