The skills and abilities required to study in this course include:

Communication Skills

- You can listen to and understand instructions from your teacher, Elders, Knowledge Holders and guest speakers.
- You can participate in yarning circles and group discussions in a respectful way.
- You can share your ideas and thoughts when you feel comfortable.
- You can read short texts, stories and classroom resources.
- You can write short reflections, answers to questions, and descriptions about community, culture and pathways.

Physical Skills

- You are able to sit, listen and participate in classroom learning and yarning activities.
- You can take part in community-based learning experiences, walks/activities on Country and hands-on activities.
- You can use a computer, tablet or phone for online learning activities when required.

Cognitive Skills

- You can listen to and understand information about culture, community, identity and connection to Country.
- You can follow instructions for practical or cultural activities.
- You can reflect on your personal learning journey and set goals with the support of your teacher.
- You can think about community issues, cultural perspectives and your own future pathways.
- You can focus on classroom tasks, activities and discussions for up to two hours at a time

Behavioural & Social Skills

- You are interested in learning more about your culture, community connections and future pathways.
- You can work respectfully with other students, teachers, Elders and community members.
- You can participate in group activities, yarning circles and cultural learning in a safe and positive way.
- You can attend classes regularly and manage your time with support from your teacher.
- You can reflect on your behaviour and choices in a learning environment.

Digital Skills

- You can log in to a computer or device using a username and password.
- You can search the internet to find simple information about culture, history, community events or learning topics.
- You can open, save and organise files such as photos, worksheets or reflections.
- You can use a keyboard and mouse or touchscreen to complete online tasks.
- You can use email or a learning platform to receive messages and share files with your teacher.
- You can recognise common software icons used for word processing, video viewing and online research.
