

The Passport Program – a training and career opportunity



The Passport Program is an 8 week program providing participants with entry level skills for employment in community services or health sector roles.

This Program will provide you with credit transfers towards qualifications in the community services and health industries, including Allied Health, aged care, disability, and home and community care.

Passport Program Overview

3 days per week over 8 weeks including:

- Face to face lessons and online learning
- A work placement component
- Career counselling

Participants will undertake training in the following 5 Nationally Accredited Units of Competency:

- CHCCOM005 Communicate and work in health or community services
- CHCDIV001 Work with diverse people
- HLTWHS002 Follow safe work practices for direct client care
- HLTWHS006 Manage personal stressors in the work environment
- HLTINF001 Comply with infection prevention and control policies and procedures

On completion of the program students receive a Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment for each of the units completed successfully. Students can transition to:

- a. Employment that does not require a full qualification.
- b. Completing a full qualifications and receiving credit for the completed Units of Competency
- c. Undertaking a traineeship and receive credits for the completed Units of Competency,
